- Chirp by Kate Messner* (A girl tries to figure out an experience that she had with a gymnastics coach that made her uncomfortable and could have led to further assault.)

- Speak by Laurie Halse Anderson* (trigger warning: description of rape, and a physical assault/attempted rape. This is an excellent story, with a movie and graphic novel version to go with it. However, it was written in 1999, so there are a few references that are a bit dated.)
- Speak the graphic novel* (beautifully illustrated and more up to date companion to the original YA novel.)
- Swagger by Carl Deuker (High school boy moves to a new town and tries to make his way to college on his school basketball team. Trigger: sexual assault against male by

- coach, teen death. Lots of basketball jargon in here, but would be perfect for a high school athlete.)
- Split by Swati Avashti (Teen boy escapes physically abusive household to brother's house where they try to move on together. Trigger: violent descriptions of physical abuse)
- Sparrow by Mary Cecelia Jackson (Teen girl begins an unhealthy dating relationship that ends in violence. She has to find her voice and move on after a brutal assault. Trigger: Physical violence and just a very intense story overall.)
